## **COVID-19 At Work:**

## OSHA SAFE WORKPLACE REGULATIONS

The Occupational Health and Safety Act of 1970, Section 5, contains the following general rule for all workplaces:



"Each employer...shall furnish to each of his employees employment and a place of employment which are free from recognized hazards that are causing or are likely to cause death or serious physical harm to his employees..."

Specifically, as to COVID-19, the Occupational Health and Safety Administration (OSHA) has stated as follows:



"Employers are obligated to provide their workers with PPE [Personal Protective Equipment] needed to keep them safe while performing their jobs. The types of PPE required during a COVID-19 outbreak will be based on the risk of being infected with SARS-CoV-2 while working and job tasks that may lead to exposure."

Several OSHA standards and directives are directly applicable to protecting healthcare workers against transmission of infectious diseases:



OSHA's <u>Bloodborne Pathogens standard (29 CFR 1910.1030)</u>, which provides protection of workers from exposures to blood and body fluids that may contain bloodborne infectious agents



OSHA's <u>Personal Protective Equipment standard (29 CFR 1910.132)</u> and OSHA's <u>Respiratory Protection standard (29 CFR 1910.134)</u>, which provide protection for workers when exposed to contact, droplet and airborne transmissible infectious agents
